“ASK FATHER STATZ”

Question: I’ve heard some priests or bishops talking about the need for penance to “make reparation” for all the abuses. Could you explain how to do this and why it is good?

Answer: Understanding that the Church is not just a human institution but rather it is a divine living organism, we call it the Mystical Body of Christ. St. Paul makes reference to this in 1 Corinthians 12:26, he says if one part is hurt, all parts are hurt with it, if one part is given special honor all parts enjoy it. Speaking to a church that is experiencing sexual immorality not even found among the pagans specifically incest, he reminds them that they are the mystical Body of Christ, with Christ as its head and every baptized member constituting the entire mystical body. An example in the natural order would be even though the toe is a small member of the body, stub a toe and see if it doesn’t affect the whole body. The reparation prayer, fasting and alms giving acts as an antidote of grace for the sin of its members.
