**ASK FATHER STATZ**

**Question:** How does the Catholic Church make a Saint? How many years does it take?”

**Answer:** The process developed is set up in five steps.

1. They have to wait five years after their death.
2. There is an investigation into their life to see if they lived a life of holiness and virtue. A good servant of God.
3. They talk to those that may have known them to see if they lived a heroic life.
4. Two verified miracles that cannot be explained by natural phenomenon. The miracles are thoroughly investigated.
5. The final step is Canonization. The declaration that this is a saint and they can be verified throughout the entire Church. Only the Pope can do this.

Thursday, January 31st, 2019 and Friday, April 5th, 2019  
Who should be screened?

All children ages 3 1/2 - 5 (preferably prior to their 4th birthday)

Why?

To allow trained teachers to evaluate each child's development for the purpose of identifying potential delays or parental concerns about their development. Additionally, children between the ages of 3 and 5 years old, must be screened before Kindergarten entrance.

**GOSPEL CONNECTION:** 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the Year  
Noah’s “third”

Raising children is a challenge: the responsibilities of providing for their safety and health, of teaching them manners and values. But four-year-old Noah’s mom and dad also want to instill in their little boy a sense of social responsibility and compassion.

How? Mom and Dad insist that Noah takes one-third of all the money he gets as gifts and allowances and shares it. Noah can choose who he shares that one third with. The other two-thirds are divided into spending money and money saved for the future. The third that Noah is to share can be given to people on a street corner, or to his friends, or even to the church collection basket. The choice is Noah’s, but each month a third of his “income” needs to be shared.

Good for Noah — and good for his parents, who are instilling in their son a natural respect for others and how sharing wealth, resources and time is the key to deeper satisfaction in life. Noah’s parents’ insistence on guiding their son in his early stages of philanthropy will result in one less person in society being selfish, greedy and short-sighted. Noah will grow up considering his good fortune as something he fully earned, yet not something to cling to.

Noah’s mom and dad wanted to teach Noah not just the act of giving but the *attitude* of giving; they want Noah to realize all he has to be grateful for, and that such gratitude should translate into generosity. It is that attitude that Jesus exalts in the widow’s gift. In the economy of God, numbers are not the true value of giving: it is what we give from our want, not from our extra, that reflects what we truly value, what good we actually want to accomplish, what we really want our lives and world to be. In the Gospel scheme of things, it is not the amount of content of the gift but the measure of the love, selflessness and commitment that directs the gift that is great before God; for Christ calls us not to seek greater things or talents to astound the world but for greater love and selflessness with which to enrich the world. Noah already gets it.
