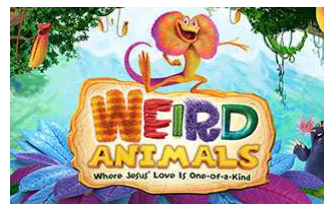

GOSPEL CONNECTION: 4th Sunday of Easter
"The Pajama Diaries"

The Pajama Diaries is cartoonist Jill Kaplan's daily adventures of the Kaplan family: modern-multitasking mom Jill, her easy-going yet bluntly honest husband, Rob, and their two teenage daughters, Amy and Jess.

In one episode [March 14, 2018], Jill has had a tough day dealing with the self-absorbed teenage angst of her two daughters. That evening, sitting with her husband, she shares her frustration and exasperation.

"It's not just the stuff they notice that bugs me." Mom laments. "It's the stuff they don't. The little things: driving them places, buying their favorite snacks, making sure they wear sunscreen . . . All of that goes unnoticed. [Sigh] I know I'm complaining, but it really bugs me."

Rob embraces his exhausted wife. "Congratulations."

"What?" Jill asks.

Rob explains, "You're every mother on the planet."

Jill quietly replies, "Weird how lonely it is being in good company."

The vocation of motherhood is very much an extension of the vocation of the Good Shepherd. In their total and complete love for their children, moms (and dads!) are the hand of God leading us through the rocky roads of life and catching us when we fall; in the wisdom of their experience and in their constant and patient support, they are the "voice" of the Good Shepherd calling us to the safety and forgiveness of home. Christ speaks in many voices — including our own. We can be the "voice" of Christ's compassion, comfort, forgiveness and peace in even our smallest and simplest words and acts of kindness and generosity.
